Ingredients:


- marshmallow peeps-chicks (multiple packages)
- Pretzels (one packages)
- Coconut
- Chocolate Chips
- green food coloring (one bottle)
- jellybean eggs (one package)

First, put chocolate chips in a bowl and microwave just until melted (maybe one minute). Stir then let the chocolate cool slightly. Put coconut in bowl with a few drops of green. Stir until the coconut is green. Break pretzels into 1 ½ inch pieces. Mix pretzels with chocolate. With a large spoon, make mounds of chocolate/pretzel mixture

onto a wax paper lined baking sheet. Use the back of spoon and lightly press the middle of each mound to form nest.

Sprinkle dyed coconut around edge of a nest. THEN PRESS IN THE MIDDLE A CUTE COLORED PEEP CHICK and jellybean eggs. Enjoy!
